

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
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Simple version

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



How many sheep can you find?




This week's challenge page includes two posters. After making them, how about putting them up in your window so that other people can enjoy them?

Why not copy the words of the Psalm and make a poster with pictures around the words? There is an example blow (in Welsh)




This is Dilwyn the sheep. He has run away and likes to hide! He has hidden in overy page of this pack. See how many times you can find him.

Fluffy Sheep

You will need:

Cotton wool, empty yoghurt pot, PVA glue, paintbrush. white card, felt pens, pencil, scissors,






1. Turn yoghurt pot upside down and cover with PVA glue.



2. Cover the yoghurt pot with small balls of cotton wool.





3. Draw a head for your sheep - don't forget his eyes & nose! Cut out.





4. Glue the head on to your fluffy sheep.





Pom Pom Sheep

You will need:

wool, cup, black card, cereal/yoghurt box googly eyes

(if you don't have any draw eyes on white card) pencil, scissors, PVA glue, paintbrush.





Turn cup upside down & place on opened box. draw around.



Draw a small circle inside the large circle so it looks like a doughnut & then draw some lines to make a C.



3. Cut out.



Put C shape back on box & draw around. Cut out so you have 2 shapes exactly the same.




Cut a piece of wool about 30cm long.



6. Place like picture on one of the pieces of card.



7. Place 2nd shape on top.



8. Start to wrap wool around the card. Make sure that the piece of wool between the cards doesn't fall out.




9. Keep winding the wool around the card until it is thick. Cut the wool.



Get a scissors & place between the 2 pieces of card. Cut



cutting, it will look like this....





13. Gently pull out your 2 pieces of card.



2 pieces of wool.



14. Cut away the 15. Draw the head of your sheep - don't forget the ears! Cut out.



Glue googly eyes onto head & then glue head onto your pom pom.

Psalm 23 Sheep

You will need:

Wool (white, grey or cream) Psalm 23 (at bottom of page) curtain ring, black card, googly eyes, pencil, scissors, PVA glue, paintbrush.







23 & draw around outside ring. Cut out.



1. Place curtain ring on Psalm 2. Cut a long length of wool (5 lengths of an adults arm or 3 metres works well □□ If you have thick wool you will need less!)



3. Tie one end of the wool to the curtain ring.



around the ring, make sure you leave no gaps.



4. Carefully wrap the wool 5. Cover all of the ring with 6. Put a line of PVA wool & then tie at the top & cut off any excess wool.



glue all around the ring.



Stick the circle of Psalm 23 onto the glued wool (make sure your words are the right way up!)



8. Draw the head of your sheep don't forget the ears! Cut out.



9. Put some glue on the back of the googly eyes & stick to head.



10. Add a blob of glue to the top of your curtain ring & stick on the head.



11. Cut some wool, thread through the hook at the top & tie.

Sheep muffins

Ingredients:

200g of self raising flour 100g of fine sugar 1 large egg 3 fluid ounces of sunflower oil 5 fluid ounces of milk ½ tsp vanilla essence

Jam or lemon curd 600g icing sugar 300g butter

Small Marshmallows Chocolate buttons to decorate the muffins

Making the muffins

- Preheat the oven to a temperature of 190 degrees Centigrade/ 375 degrees Fahrenheit. Line 6 large cups to hold muffins with lining paper and set aside.
- Sieve the flour into the bowl and add the sugar and whisk.
- Beat together the egg, sunflower oil, milk and vanilla essence in a cup. Pour the mixture into the dry ingredients and mix carefully with a fork until it's all come together.
- Put into each of the cups half a dessert spoonful of batter.
- Place a teaspoon of jam or lemon curd in the centre of each muffin then another half spoonful of the batter.
- Bake for 15 to 20 minutes until muffins are firm and golden.
- Remove the muffins from the oven and let them cool.

Addurno

- Beat the sifted icing sugar together with the butter add a little boiling water if necessary. Beat to a smopoth paste and spread on the muffins until the tops are completely covered.
- Place the marshmallows to cover the top of the muffins.
- Use a chocolate button as the head of the sheep. Stick it on using a blocb of the icing.
- Break another chocolate button in half and stick the two halves on to make ears.
- Use a wooden cocktail stick to add two blobs of icing to make eyes.

All finished. It's easy to make tasty muffin sheep!

The sheep pen


Use different materials to make a sheep

- Green lush fields
- Blue calm water
- Black a dark, black valley

Create a small shepherds staff.

Make a sheep pen with twigs, lollipop sticks or small stones.















Draw a sheep you could trace the outline above. Write your name on the lost sheep, put the sheep in the pen and say a prayer asking God to look after you.



Ask God to look after your friends and family and keep them safe in his sheep pen.





A safe place

Do you like to make a den to play in?

The Psalm talks about the shepherd (God) leading us to a beautiful, quiet place.

Why not make a den for you to be quiet in. You can use a blanket and cushions or you could make a den in the garden.

Your den would be a good place for you to talk to God about things - to pray.































Memory Verse Game

Games



You will need:

A copy of the verse on the jigsaw (below) Scissors

How to play:

Carefully cut out the jigsaw pieces.

Mix up the pieces.


Put the pieces back together to create the whole verse again.

Pull out a piece and try saying the verse.

Pull out another piece and try saying the verse.

Do this until you say the verse without one piece of the jigsaw.

Tip: You might want to stick the template to cardboard first - a cereal box would be great.



Sheep under a cup

You will need:

3 identical cups

Sheep - a ball of cotton wool or pom-pom

2 players

How to play:

Place the 3 cups in a row.

Hide the sheep under one of the cups.

Move the cups around.

Ask the other player to guess which cup the sheep is under.

If they guess correctly, switch over and the other player hides the sheep.

"I am the good shepherd. I know my sheep, and they know me."




You will need:

- 10 cotton wool balls or marshmallows (sheep)
- A straw for each player
- The sheep pen pictures cut out
- Timer watch or phone

How to play:

- Fold the pen to make a square shape with a small opening.
- Place the cotton wool balls or marshmallows outside the pen.
- Each player is given a turn to try and blow the cotton wool balls (or 'marshmallows') into the inside of the pen. This is quite difficult as the sheepfold can move while herding the 'sheep' - but it's fun!
- If it's too hard, tape the pen to the table or floor so it doesn't move.
- The winner will be the player who gets the 10 'sheep' into the pen in the shortest time.





Hide and sheep

You will need: 2 or more players

How to play:

One player searches for the other who has hidden.

The player who hides can bleat like a sheep occasionally to give a clue to the seacher.





Pairs



- Cut out the cards below and place them face down on the table.
- Mix them up.
- Players need to turn two cards at a time. The aim of the game is to try and find a pair.
- If a player finds a pair then they keep it.
- If he doesn't get a pair he puts the cards back face down.
- The winner is the person with the most pairs of cards at the end.
- If two players have the same number of pairs, the one with the shepherds wins.








Hide the sheep!

Sheep Bingo




You will need:

- 1. The pictures of the 12 sheep individually cut out and a bag or cap to put in them.
- 2. Cards (below) for each of the four players cut out.
- 3. Pieces of paper or small stones to cover the sheep picture squares 12 for each player.


How to Play


- 1. Put pictures of the sheep in the cap or bag.
- 2. One of the players is chosen as a caller.
- 3. The caller takes a sheep picture out of the cap or bag and shows it to each player.
- 4. Whoever has this picture on his/her card, then covers it with a small stone or square of paper.
- 5. The winner is the first to cover each picture on his / her card.





Did you know that while

Just as the shepherd looked for the stray sheep, Jesus is looking for us and wants us to come back to him.












I once had 100 sheep but one of them has gone, you might have guessed that I won't rest until it's safe back home.
